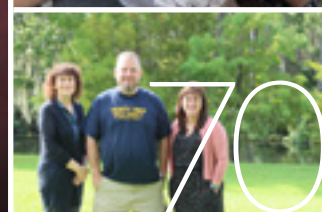
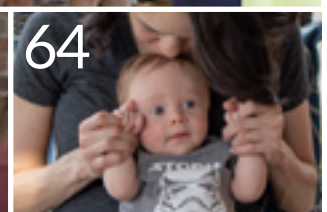
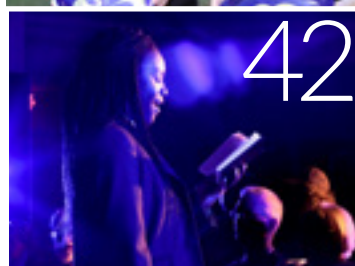

We said goodbye to the 135 members of the Class of 2019, and my goodness, their achievements were significant and their efforts valuable. As a class, they achieved beyond expectation.

- *They were awarded more than \$12 million in performance-based scholarships.*
- *The National Merit Scholarship Corporation recognized 22% of the class for its academic achievement.*
- *During its time at Trinity, this class dedicated 28,661 community service hours to the Orlando Science Center, our Blue & Gold Society, Habitat for Humanity, the Central Florida Zoo, Florida District Key Club, and so many more worthwhile organizations.*
- *Our a capella choir was ranked in the top eight at the International Championship of High School a capella South Region competition.*
- *Our theater department received a community engagement award through the Dr. Phillips Applause Awards.*
- *The Trinity Voice won a Gold designation from the Florida Scholastic Press Association and received two Gold Crown Awards from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association.*
- *The National Speech and Debate Association ranked Trinity Prep among the top 10% of programs nationwide, and we had seven Academic All-Americans.*
- *One hundred and one seniors earned at least one varsity letter this year. Trinity Prep athletic teams won five regional championships and appeared in a state final-four, and the class produced one state champion, five Academic All-Americans, and eight All-American athletes.*

Simply stated, this class is incredible!

Additionally, we have been busy working on school operations and trying to create the healthiest school environment possible. We have completed the Master Plan for the school, and we look forward to sharing the vision of Trinity Tomorrow with you. We rebuilt the pool, strengthened security at the entrance to the campus with the addition of a kiosk, and are building a deck for social and learning space between the Maughan Academic Center and Brokaw Hall. Judge Christopher R. “Casey” Cooper was appointed to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in March 2014, following his unanimous confirmation by the U.S. Senate. Judge Cooper received a B.A. summa cum laude from Yale University in 1988. He went on to graduate with distinction from Stanford Law School in 1993, serving as president of the Stanford Law Review and as a board member of the law school’s pro bono legal clinic.

Following law school, Judge Cooper clerked for Chief Judge Abner J. Mikva on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit and from 1994 to 1996 served in the U.S. Department of Justice as a special assistant to the Deputy Attorney General.

Judge Cooper then entered private practice, where for 17 years at Miller, Cassidy, Larroca & Lewin (1996-2000), Baker Botts (2001-2012), and Covington & Burling LLP (2012-2014) he represented clients in a wide range of litigation matters in both Washington and London.

Judge Cooper is a 1984 graduate of Trinity and a recipient of its Distinguished Alumni award. He has been involved in numerous civic and professional organizations and currently serves as secretary of the governing board of St. Albans School in Washington, D.C.

Judge Cooper lives in Washington with his wife and two sons, Lincoln and Leo. ✨

He is the editor emeritus of *The Journal of Robotic Surgery* and editor of the first-ever robotic urology textbook. He has authored over 100 peer reviewed academic publications and multiple textbook chapters.

He has published landmark articles illustrating new surgical techniques and correlated clinical outcomes. He is the founder of the International Prostate Cancer Foundation (IPCF), an organization dedicated to patient awareness and education. He currently serves as President of the Society of Robotic Surgery and was an initial founding member.

PARDIS SABETI '93, M.D., D.PHIL.

Dr. Pardis Sabeti is a professor at Harvard University, the Harvard School of Public Health, the Broad Institute of Harvard and MIT, and a Howard Hughes Medical Institute Investigator. Her computational genomic lab has contributed to widely varying fields – including human evolutionary biology, viral sequencing, information theory, rural disease surveillance, and education efforts in West Africa. They aim to create comprehensive approaches for detecting, containing, and treating deadly infectious diseases, including Lassa virus, Ebola virus, Zika virus, and *Babesiosis microtia*. She has invested in capacity building and education, enabling the first diagnosis of Ebola in Sierra Leone and Nigeria, training over seventy African scientists through summer-long educational programs, and establishing genome centers in West Africa. Dr. Sabeti completed her undergraduate degree at MIT, her graduate work at Oxford University

as a Rhodes Scholar, and her medical degree *summa cum laude* from Harvard Medical School as a Soros Fellow. Sabeti has received numerous awards and honors, including World Economic Forum (WEF) Young Global Leader, National Geographic Emerging Explorer, the National Academy of Sciences Richard Lounsbery Award, Smithsonian American Ingenuity Award for Natural Science, *TIME* magazine “Person of the Year” as one of the Ebola fighters, and *TIME*'s 100 Most Influential. She is also the host of “Against All Odds” included as part of AP stats classes nationwide, and is the lead singer of the rock band “Thousand Days.” ✨



SAM STARK

At Rollins College, Sam Stark's responsibilities include Community Relations, Communications, Events and Scheduling, Print Services, and the Winter Park Institute. With a diverse and extensive background in marketing and community relations, Stark came "home" to his alma mater in 2017, where he had volunteered since graduation. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry was Trinity Prep's very special guest in early February.

Coincidentally, both Trinity Prep and the Central Florida Episcopal Diocese celebrated 50th anniversaries last year, and the Fiftieth Annual Diocesan Convention of The Episcopal Church in Central Florida took place on Trinity Prep's campus. That coincidence helped Reverend Sonia Sullivan-Clifton "The Rev" construct a plan to bring Bishop Curry to campus to speak at a very special chapel service.

Bishop Curry shared his message of love with the Trinity family with an expressive homily in a packed school auditorium. At times funny and at times wise, Bishop Curry stayed on message with stories of his own experiences, linking them to

the stories that we all share. "Love is the way. Love is the only way that has ever changed anybody, anything for the good." He asked the students to think about the people in their lives: "teachers, coaches, scout masters, a priest, a pastor, a rabbi, a grandparent, parents who have helped you. Nine times out of ten they didn't do it because they got anything out of it; they didn't do it for themselves. They did it because they cared about you." He went on to say, "It feels good to be loved. (pause) Can I get an Amen from somebody?" Amen! "It feels good to be loved."

The Reverend Sonia Sullivan-Clifton had this to say about Bishop Curry's

visit: "It was an incredible honor and a very rare opportunity to have Bishop Curry join us." The Reverend Rich Towers added, "Bishop Curry made headlines last year for his inspirational homily at the wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle. Without a doubt, Bishop Curry has used the momentum of last year's royal wedding to promote the enduring message of God's love. He continued to share that vision with the Trinity Prep community and challenged us to embrace God's love, which is offered to everyone." 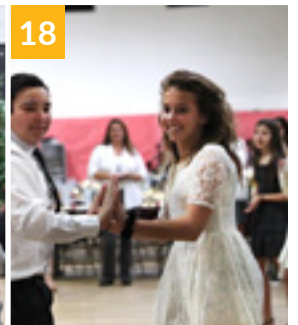

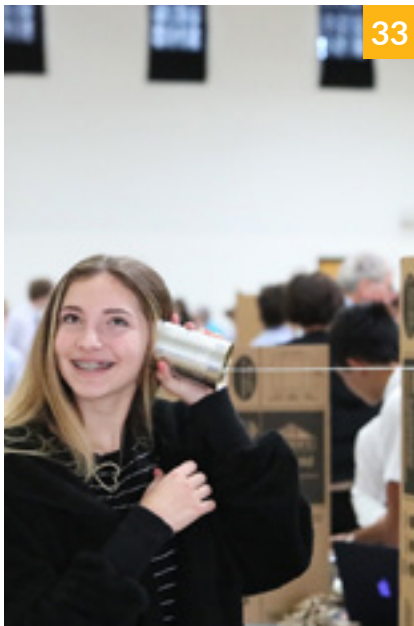

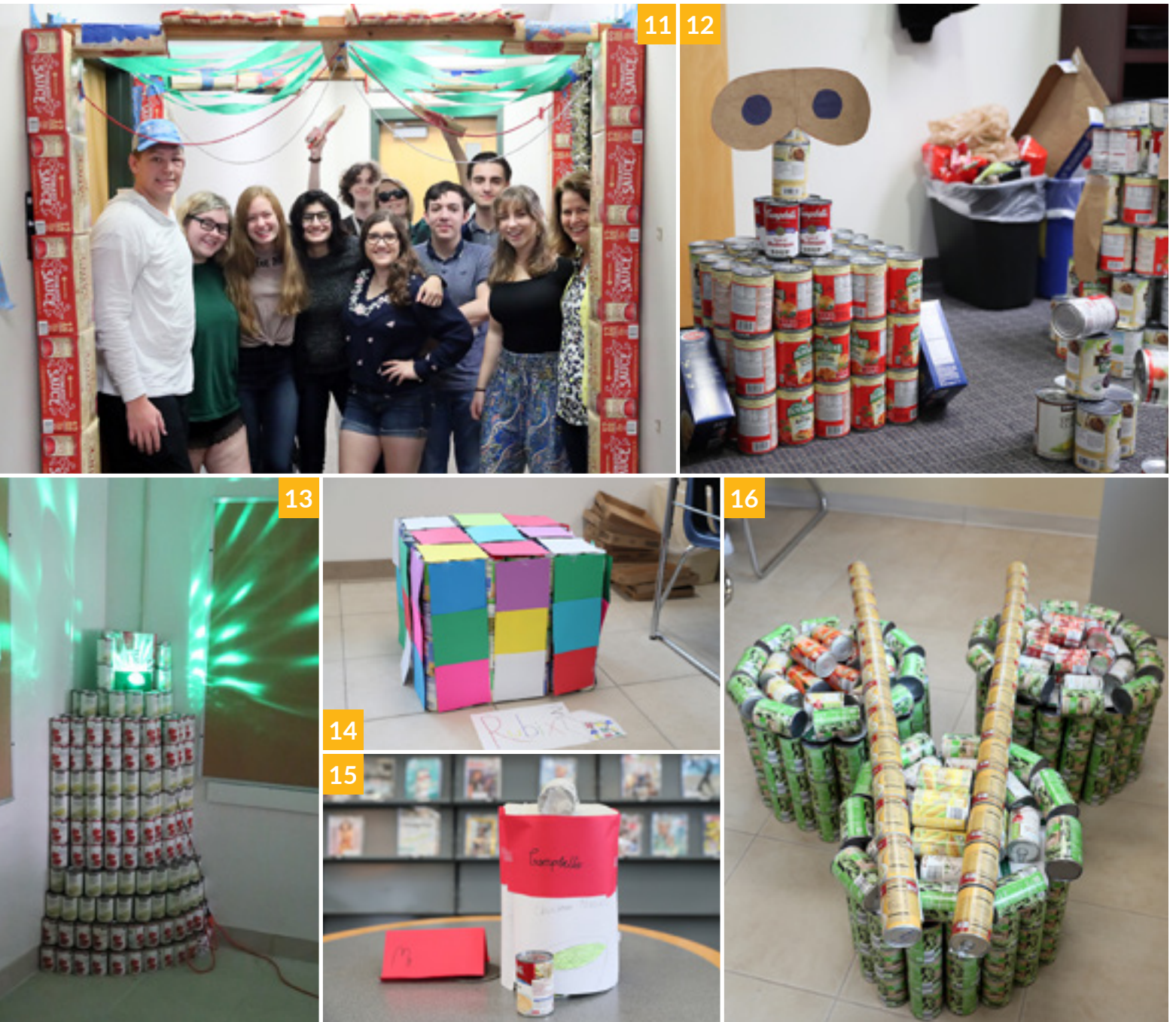

LAWRENCE GOLOMB '89

Lawrence graduated from Trinity Prep with letters in tennis every year from 1984 to 1989, starting on the varsity tennis team as a 7th grader and playing line five his first year. He played line one every subsequent year until graduation, losing only three matches over six years. He was named to the All Orange County tennis team in 1988 and 1989 and MVP in boys tennis at Trinity Prep in 1988. He won six district first-place titles in singles and doubles and three second-place titles.

He attended the University of Alabama on a full tennis scholarship, graduated from UCF, and has worked in pharmaceutical sales for 21 years, currently for Novartis Pharmaceuticals. He, his wife, and their two children live in Alpharetta, Georgia. He still enjoys competing in tennis leagues in Atlanta, going to the gym, and running.

MIKE SPATOLA

Mike coached basketball, baseball, and football and taught history, geography, and physical education at Trinity Prep from 1977 to 1987. He was Trinity's athletic director from 1984 to 1987.

During his time coaching, his teams won a district title in basketball, and his players were named to All District, All County, and All State teams in basketball and football. He coached sixteen of the previous Athletic Hall of Fame inductees. Mike was named Boys Basketball Coach of the Year at Lawrence Academy and participated in the AAU Nationals as coach of the South Shore Warriors in Long Island, NY.

Mike has a bachelor's degree in political science from Florida Southern College and a master's degree in social studies education from Nova Southeastern University. After leaving Trinity, he coached and taught at Lake Howell High School, Lawrence Academy, St. John the Baptist High School, and Friends Academy in Locust Valley. His many accolades include selection as graduation speaker at Friends Academy, being chosen Teacher of the Year at Trinity Prep in 1984, and chairing the history department at Lawrence Academy. Before he retired, he coached and served as athletic director at Durham Academy, where he received the Distinguished Faculty Award. He and his wife Pam live in Durham, NC. They have four children and nine grandchildren.

RYAN TRUCHULET '04

Ryan lettered in cross country every year from 1998 to 2003 and in track from 1999 to 2004. During his high school athletic career, he was state champion in 4x800m relay twice; state runner-up in 2004; and both a regional champion and district champion from 2002 to 2004. He was a scoring member of three regional champion cross country teams; four district champion cross country teams; and three regional champion track teams. He was Trinity's Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2004 and captain of both the cross country and track teams. He held the Trinity record for 800m from 2003 to 2005 and for the 4x800m from 2002 to 2007.

Ryan graduated summa cum laude from Princeton with a B.A. in geosciences. He has both a master's degree and a doctorate in meteorology from Florida State University. He has written weather analysis for the Washington Post, USA Today, and Bloomberg News and is co-founder of the weather consulting firm Weather Tiger. Ryan, his wife, Dr. Erica Staehling, and their son Isaac live in Tallahassee. 🌸

Arts Hall of Fame Induction

Every spring the Trinity family gathers to celebrate the newest inductees to the Trinity Prep Arts Hall of Fame.

This year we welcomed Brian Gold '02 and Liza Luxenberg '05 to that distinguished group of alumni and faculty members who comprise the Arts Hall of Fame. Brian and Liza shared stories of their Trinity Prep days as well as their own arts journeys in an all-school assembly in April. Following the assembly and a reception outside the Freitag and Falk Black Box Theater, Brian and Liza met with theater students and guests for a more intimate exchange of questions and answers. Here are their bios and excerpts from their speeches.

BRIAN GOLD '02

Brian D. Gold, AEA Stage Manager, graduated from Trinity Preparatory School in 2002 after attending grades 6 through 12. He attended Emerson College and graduated with a BFA in Production/Stage in 2006. Highlights of his stage career include “Broadway, An Act of God,” “The Phantom of the Opera,” “Hair: Summer of Love,” “The Normal Heart” (Tony Winner: Best Revival), “Pal Joey,” “9 to 5: the Musical,” and national tours of “Billy Elliot the Musical,” “Seussical,” and

“Peter Pan.” Brian also worked on a number of off-Broadway and regional shows as well as on workshops and readings. After 10 years as a stage manager, Brian made a career change and is currently the special education co-teacher for geometry and Algebra 2/Trigonometry at Energy Tech High School in Astoria, NY. Brian credits his success in stage management to ongoing support from Janine Papin and the Trinity family. Brian continues to dedicate his work to his brother Eric Gold, R.I.P. 1/20/08 and his father Randy Gold, R.I.P. 7/1/13.



SPEECH EXCERPTS:

Trinity family now is Trinity family forever. No matter whether you stay close or move far away, Trinity family doesn't change. Since before I even started at Trinity, the Rock has been a centerpiece to this campus. It is still here and has been a part of every student's experience at Trinity. Think of the Rock as a metaphor for your Trinity family. It changes its appearance constantly, but it will always be there for you.

Many things have changed on campus since I left. There are few teachers left from when I was here, but I can tell you that each one of them was a big influence on who I am today. From Tom Taylor to Joel Bicknell to those who joined after I graduated, my friends Richard Width and Donna Walker, these people have kept theater at Trinity alive over the years. The most important of them all is Janine Papin; without her guidance, care, and time, I would have probably not taken the path I did. As a teacher myself, I know we all strive to make a difference. Making a difference is hard, but it is even harder to make a lasting impact. Thank you, Janine, for making a lasting impact. I would have never gotten to work around the country, worked with celebrities, or worked on Broadway without your support. Your support for me and every one of your students has changed Trinity theater forever.

Now, I have debated this for a month, but you only live once and chances are slim that I'll ever be in front of 800 people again. So I'm taking a selfie: 3, 2, 1. Thank you for your time and thank you for this honor. Go Saints!

LIZA LUXENBERG '05

Liza graduated from Indiana University, where she double majored in theater and an individualized major program in stage management. She joined Aurora Productions shortly after graduation in 2009. Aurora provides production management and technical supervision for commercial and non-profit theater on Broadway, off-Broadway, and throughout the world. Among her credits at Aurora are supervision for the Tony Award-winning Broadway productions of "Red," "Jerusalem," "Matilda the Musical," "Hello, Dolly!" "Sister Act The Musical," "Bullets Over Broadway," "School of Rock," "Shuffle Along," "Mean Girls," and this season's "To Kill A Mockingbird." Liza has guest lectured at Indiana University, The University of Maryland, New York University, and Columbia University.

SPEECH EXCERPTS:

All week I have been talking to my friends and colleagues about what I would say to this room full of people as I accept this honor of being inducted into the Arts Hall of Fame. I was nervous to speak

in front of all of you, but it wasn't until last night that I realized that there was nowhere else on this campus that I ever felt more comfortable than standing on this stage. I learned how to run a table saw in the shop offstage left, called my first show as a stage manager in that corner, ran the light board from the booth up there, made my sister Betsy take a tech theater class with me one semester, and led the Alma Mater at my graduation with two of my classmates.

If there is one thing that I hope to impart to you today, it's to enjoy your time here as much as possible and not be afraid to be yourself. There are so many supportive teachers here that are all looking out for you. You may be worried about if you will have a pop quiz right now, but by the time you look back, it won't be about the pop quiz anymore. It will be about what it means to graduate as a Trinity kid and taking that with you wherever you go, whatever you do. Don't be afraid to pursue your dreams, whether they're on the field, in the classroom, or on this very stage. If you're lucky enough, you will get to come back here one day to stand on this stage and tell the next generation of Trinity kids your story too. I'd like to thank my family for always encouraging me to pursue my dreams, the Patrons of the Arts, and so many teachers who were in the room with me whenever I needed them, for helping me pave my own way to Broadway. ✨

“The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time,” originally a novel written by Mark Haddon, was condensed into a one-act play and ran in the Freitag & Falk Theater Oct. 19-21, 2018.

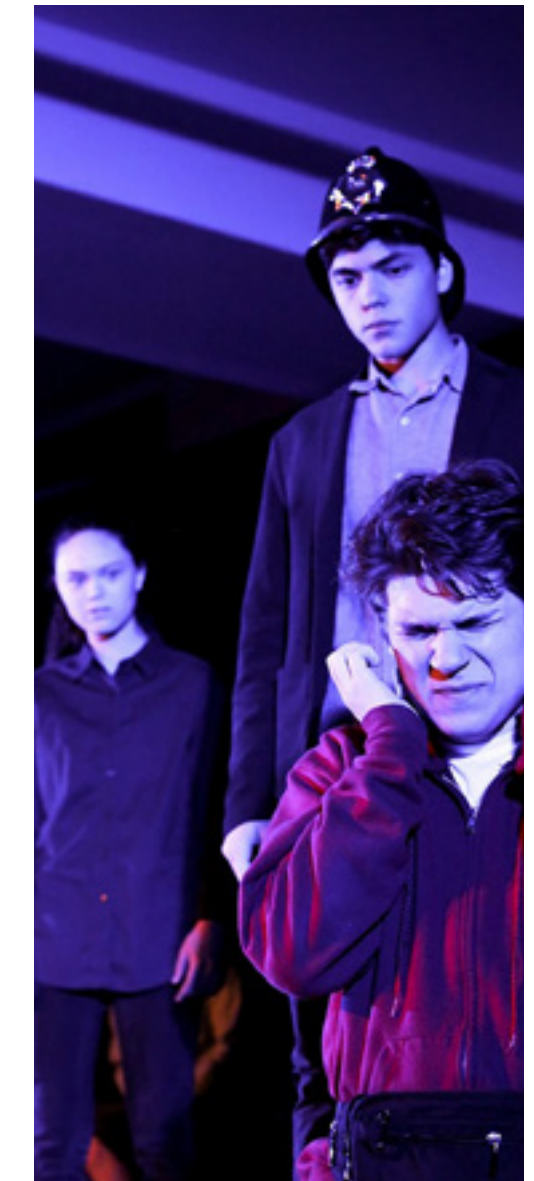
The weekly rehearsals for the show started in the middle of August, directed by the Fine Arts Department Chair Janine Papin. The one-act follows Christopher Boone (Josh Lefkowitz '20), a fifteen-year-old boy with autism who uncovers truths about himself while trying to solve the murder of his neighbor's dog.

Papin first saw the play in the West End of London while she was on a trip with Trinity students in the summer of 2016, and was immediately taken with

it. “I was so moved by this story that I immediately wanted to direct it,” Papin said.

The one-act was performed for the Florida Theater Conference in October and won first place, while Josh Lefkowitz won the award for best actor. It was also performed at the Thespian District Festival in November.

“I’ve never done a one-act before so it’s a really condensed version of the show,” Olivia Miller '19 said. “It’s only



like 45 minutes, so it’s much shorter. It’s about half the time of any other show I’ve ever done and that’s weird because it means you have less time to develop a character.”

Unlike some of the previous plays that have been performed at Trinity, this play is a very realistic story which made it challenging for the actors and actresses to reimagine themselves as their characters. Benji Santiago '20, who plays the character Mr. Shears, said the most difficult part of



performing was putting himself into a real life situation even without having experience with an autistic person. “This play kind of deals with more realistic aspects of life like mental illness, because the main character, is autistic. Josh Lefkowitz does a really good job portraying that,” Santiago said.

Thomas Lightsey '21 plays the role of Ed Boone, Christopher's father. In the past productions Lightsey took part in, he mostly played characters that

were over the top, so playing the role of a dad and finding different ways to express anger in this play was an immense change for him. “Our cast is phenomenal,” Lightsey said. “We have a really good time rehearsing and there's some dark moments this year, especially with my character. So it's really nice when you can go through those together and know that you can smile when then you look up because you're with your best friends.”

Papin said cutting the play into one act was a very difficult task, considering how wonderful she thought the story was, and hopes to be able to direct the entire play next year. “I hope that the audience will find understanding and connection with Christopher's journey,” Papin said. “What makes us different can be the very thing that brings out our gifts and talents. We all can accomplish much. As Christopher asks at the end of the show, 'Does that mean that I can do anything?' I believe that the answer is 'yes.'” 🌟

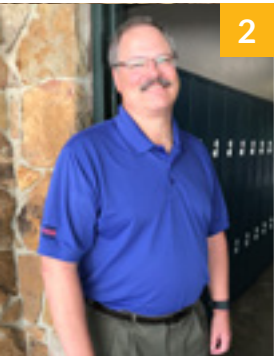




All Alumni Reunion
